- Education programs for youth and public, maintain garden beds with individuals and work crews, support local native plant growers.

Marketing/Publicity

- Provide publicity for events. Distribute educational materials around the watershed. Develop promotional and educational materials. Design and purchase promotional items.

FOEC Board (one meeting per month in-person or zoom)

- Board members oversee projects, make decisions on direction, serve on committees, and help with projects as needed. Handle administrative needs.

President: Sets agenda, runs meetings, helps where needed. Contact with partners.

Vice President: Takes place of president if needed, develops education calendar, helps committee chairs.

Treasurer: Maintains financial records, pays invoices.

Secretary: Takes and produces meeting minutes, maintains organization archive.

Membership: Maintains membership/friends contact list. Tracks dues and donations. Relationships with present and future members and volunteers.

Directors: Chairs or serves on a committee, help as needed.
